Nadine Gogu is the director of the Independent Journalism Center (IJC) in Chisinau, Moldova. The IJC is a leading media resource center in Moldova and provides assistance to journalists and media institutions throughout the country. Nadine helps carry out the organization's mission to promote independent and impartial media in Moldova and oversees the center's journalist training and legal support programs.

Nadine entered journalism in 1995 by helping launch "TIMPUL" ("The Times"), today a leading newspaper in Moldova. Nadine has worked as an editor, reporter and editor-in-chief. In addition to her current role at IJC, Nadine is an instructor at Chisinau School of Advanced Journalism and a correspondent for Reporters Without Borders, an international media watchdog organization based in Paris.

Nadine graduated from Moldova State University in 1992 and earned an M.A. in Journalism and Mass Communications at Oklahoma State University in 2007 as an Edmund S. Muskie Graduate Fellow.



Established in 1994, the Independent Journalism Center (IJC) is a non-governmental organization (NGO) that provides assistance to journalists and media institutions in Moldova. IJC's mission is to support professional journalism and contribute to the consolidation of a qualitative, independent and impartial press.

A long time partner of Eurasia Foundation, IJC led a coalition of more than 70 civic organizations that conducted media monitoring in the lead up to this year's parliamentary elections in Moldova. Most recently, Eurasia Foundation, with funding from the Royal Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs and USAID, launched the Developing Viable Media Initiative. Eurasia Foundation awarded IJC with a grant to create a Circulation Audit Bureau to track and collect data on ownership, advertising revenues and circulation of publications across the country.
